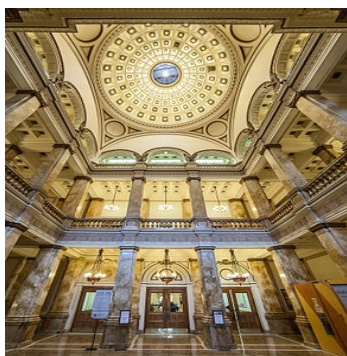


Transition Collaboration Professional Development Series

Thursday, January 5 Learning Outcomes: Participants will extend their knowledge regarding the Post Secondary Plan (PTP) and how to create best practice measurable post secondary goals. The Transition Improvement Plan will be reviewed as a tool for planning. Participants will explore their district data for Indicators 1, 2, 8, 13, and 14. Data will be examined based on race, gender, disability, and socioeconomic status.	5:00-8:30pm	Best Practice Transition Planning
Thursday, January 12 Learning Outcomes: This session will focus on resources to locate and identify transition assessments appropriate for individual students as well as a demo of the NEW WiTransition app and transition lesson plans.	5:00-8:30pm	Transition Assessment and Other Transition Tools
Thursday, February 2 Learning Outcomes: This session will focus on Post Secondary Programs to help students reach their Post Secondary Educational goals. Representatives from Post Secondary Learning Institutions have been invited to present to participants.	5:00-8:30pm	College Readiness and Postsecondary Options
Thursday, March 2 Learning Outcomes: This section will include information from agencies about the range of adult service options for students with disabilities. There will be time for questions and collecting resources and information.	5:00-8:30pm	Employability and Independent Living
Thursday, March 30 Learning Outcomes: This session will focus on helping students find Community Based Integrated Employment and the supports needed. Agencies and Programs that support Community Based Integrated Employment such as Project SEARCH, Job Corps, CEO, Goodwill, Easter Seals, Pantheon Industries and WI FACETS will be invited to present to participants. This session will also feature resources to promote self advocacy in the PTP and an explanation of the PTP process.
