Tuesday , November 29, 2016	4:30-8:00pm	Effective Transition Planning for Employment Using the Postsecondary Transition Plan (PTP)

Learner Outcomes: Participants will extend and broaden their knowledge regarding the Postsecondary Transition Plan (PTP), including the changes in transition services based on the new WIOA final rule, and how to create best practice measurable postsecondary goals for employment based on student needs. Participants will explore a variety of formal and informal transition assessment tools focused on employment. The Transition Improvement Plan (TIP) will be reviewed as a tool for planning.

Tuesday, January 24, 2017	4:30-8:00pm	Building Integrated Work Experiences Including Collaboration with DVR and Other Agencies
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Learner Outcomes: Participants will expand their knowledge of current employment practices, including information regarding the new WIOA final rule, to guide transition planning from basic to specific employment needs of youth with disabilities. Participants will hear from local agencies, families, and youth on collaborative practices to support employment in the community.
