Monday, November 28	5:30-8:30pm	Effective Transition Planning for Employment Using the Postsecondary Transition Plan (PTP)
Learner Outcomes: Participants will extend and broaden their knowledge regarding the Postsecondary Transition Plan (PTP), including the changes in transition services based on the new WIOA final rule, and how to create best practice measurable postsecondary goals for employment based on student needs. The Transition Improvement Plan (TIP) will be reviewed as a tool for planning.		
Monday, December 19	5:30-8:30pm	Transition Assessment for Employment
Learner Outcomes: Participants will explore a variety of formal and informal transition assessment tools focused on employment.		
Monday, January 23	5:30-8:30pm	Building Integrated Work Experiences
Learner Outcomes: Participants will expand their knowledge of current employment practices, including information regarding the new WIOA final rule, to guide transition planning from basic to specific employment needs of youth with disabilities.		
Monday, February 27	5:30-8:30pm	Employment Support with Local Agencies
Learner Outcomes: Participants will hear from local agencies, families, and youth on collaborative practices to support employment in the community.		
Monday, April 24	5:30-8:30pm	Community Engagement to Increase Employment Outcomes
Learner Outcomes: Participants will learn about a variety of strategies (job development, community conversations, Amazing Race to Employment, etc.) to build partnerships with local employers and transition stakeholders.
