

How to Use the WiTransition App For Educators

The WiTransition App is a web-based, student-centered planning application (app) tool that helps students explore life after high school, articulate their goals, and share their perspectives to inform their Postsecondary Transition Plan (PTP).

Purpose of the WiTransition App

The WiTransition App supports meaningful development of the Postsecondary Transition Plan (PTP) and strengthens IDEA Indicator 13 / Transition Planning compliance. It mirrors the PTP to help educators, students, and families prepare for high-quality, student-led IEP Team meetings.



Note: The WiTransition App report supports—but does not replace—the PTP.

Alignment to Indicator 13/Transition Planning

The WiTransition App supports documentation of:

- A transition assessment of student preferences, interests, needs, and strengths
- Measurable postsecondary goals in education/training, employment, and independent living, where appropriate
- Transition Services and supports while in school to align with student goals
- Course of student connections tied to career interests and pathways
- Connections to family and transition partner supports
- Family and transition partner involvement in coordinated planning
- Student participation and self-advocacy in IEP Team meetings and transition planning



How Educators Can Use the App

- Guide students and families in effective use of the app
- Encourage family use and input to share perspectives, priorities, and family values
- Review app report with students prior to IEP Team meeting to guide discussion
- Use the student and family responses to prepare for the IEP Team meeting discussions
- Prepare students for student-led IEP Team meetings, promoting student voice and choice
- Gather input aligned to student measurable postsecondary goals
- Use app reports to inform the students' Postsecondary Transition Plan (PTP)
- Strengthen Indicator 13/transition planning documentation and compliance
- Share relevant sections of the report with families and transition partners to support coordinated planning (with appropriate consent)
- Support students in revisiting the app to generate an updated reports as goals, interests, or supports change.
