

# Summary of Performance (SoP)



## Procedural Requirement

“A public agency must provide the child with a summary of the student’s academic achievement and functional performance, which shall include recommendations on how to assist the student in meeting the student’s measurable postsecondary goals.”

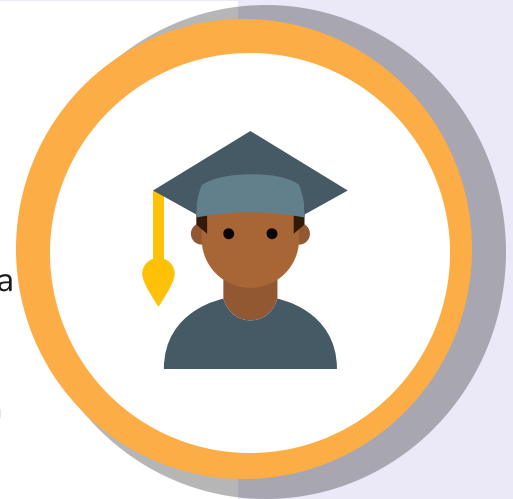

## Who Needs a Summary of Performance?

The SoP is required for students with an Individualized Education Program (IEP) who:

- Graduate from high school with a regular diploma
- Exit high school due to reaching the maximum age (21)
- Complete a High School Equivalency Diploma (HSED) within a Department of Public Instruction (DPI) approved General Education Development Option #2 (GEDP #2) program

**Note: Students who drop out of school are not required to receive a SoP.**



## When to Provide the SoP to the Student?

The summary of performance must be provided at a reasonable point prior to graduation or ending of their Free Appropriate Public Education (FAPE). It is not necessary to conduct an IEP Team meeting to develop the SoP but the SoP could be given to the student at an IEP meeting or at an exit interview.

## What Form Should be Used?

The form selected is a district decision. The district can either elect to use the Best Practice Summary of Performance document or the P3/P4 (Notice of Graduation or Ending Services due to age). # Summary of Performance (SoP) Resources

A Summary of Performance (SoP) synthesizes and organizes information from the IEP and evaluations including data on performance in academic and functional areas. The SoP includes recommendations that follow the student into adulthood.
